Macaroni Salad

- 4 cups elbow macaroni, cooked according to package directions, drained and chilled
- 1 cup red onion, chopped
- 1 cup celery, chopped
- 1 cup frozen peas, defrosted
- 1/2 cup red peppers, chopped
- 1 cup carrots, grated
- 3 eggs, hardboiled and chopped
- 1/2 lb. thinly sliced deli ham, diced

Dressing:

- 1-1/2 cups mayonnaise
- 3/4 cup sour cream
- 2 Tbsp Dijon Mustard
- 3 Tbsp white vinegar
- 1/2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp ground black pepper
- 2 tsp kosher salt
- 1 Tbsp sugar
- 1 tsp celery seed

Directions: Combine the elbows, onion, celery, peas, red peppers, carrots, eggs, and ham in a large mixing bowl. In a separate bowl, combine the mayonnaise, sour cream, Dijon mustard, vinegar, garlic powder, black pepper, salt, sugar, and celery seed. Mix until fully combined. Pour the dressing over the salad ingredients and fold until evenly coated. Chill and serve.

Barbecue Potato Salad

- 4 lbs. new potatoes, quartered
- 1/2 lb. smoked bacon (optional garnish)
- 1-1/3 cups mayonnaise
- 2-1/2 Tbsp Dijon mustard
- 3 Tbsp barbecue sauce
- 1 hardboiled egg
- 2 celery stalks, diced
- 1/2 red onion, minced
- 1/2 tsp dried thyme
- Salt and freshly ground pepper
- Fresh chives, chopped (optional garnish)

Preparation:

Cover the potatoes with water and bring them to a boil in a large stock pot over high heat. Cook until the potatoes are tender, about 30 minutes; drain. While the potatoes are cooking, render the bacon until crisp in a large skillet over medium-high heat, about 5 minutes. Drain the bacon on several paper towels and break into small, bite-size pieces. Set aside. Mix mayonnaise, mustard, barbecue sauce, and hardboiled egg in a large bowl. Slowly add the potatoes to the dressing and let them absorb the liquid, about 15 minutes. Add the celery, red onion, thyme, salt, and pepper and refrigerate until well chilled. Just before serving, garnish with the bacon and chives, if desired.



Pulled Pork Sandwiches

- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon Chile powder
- 1 tablespoon Paprika
- 2 Teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 Teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 Teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 Teaspoon Cayenne pepper
- 1 pork shoulder roast (also called Pork Butt)
- 4 onions, cut into halves
- 1 bottle good barbecue sauce and good-quality
- Hamburger rolls (for serving)
- 1 bottle good barbecue sauce

Directions:

Stir together the brown sugar, Chile powder, paprika, garlic powder, salt, black pepper and cayenne in a small bowl, Rub the mixture all over the pork shoulder. Wrap the pork in plastic wrap and refrigerate for several hours or preferably overnight.

- Preheat the oven to 300 degrees F.
- Place the pork in a large pot on a bed of the onion halves. Roast until fork tender and falling apart, about 7 hours. Remove the pork from the pot and set it on a cutting board. Slice some of the onions.
- Place the pot on the stove over medium-high heat and add 1/2 to 1 cup of hot water. Scrape the pan to loosen up the bits and cook for 5 minutes to reduce. Pour in the barbecue sauce and stir to heat. Shred the meat with two forks, add the sliced onions to the pork and then toss in the barbecue sauce until it's coated to your liking! Serve on hamburger rolls.

Chaplains Corner



In the United States of America, the Fourth of July is a national holiday when outdoor grills are heated up; beaches are packed; and cities and towns have parades and fireworks displays, picnics, and patriotic celebrations. All of this occurs because we are celebrating and remembering that on July 4, 1776, the original 13 American colonies declared their independence from Great Britain. The writers of the Declaration stated that their beliefs in a Creator, granted their freedoms with these introductory words, "We hold these truths to be [self-evident](#), that [all men are created equal](#), that they are endowed by their [Creator](#) with certain [unalienable Rights](#), that among these are [Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness](#)."

The 13 colonies had a long list of grievances against the tyranny of Great Britain, which suppressed their freedoms, so they also included these words in their declaration. "Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States."

Independence appeals to all ages. It means "freedom from the control, influence, support, and aid of others." So it's not surprising that teenagers talk about gaining their independence. Many adults have the goal of being "independently wealthy." And senior citizens want to maintain their independence. Whether anyone is ever truly independent is an interesting concept. When a person dares to pursue spiritual independence from God there is going to be some problems. What we need instead is a recognition and acceptance of our deep spiritual dependence upon God.

In Psalm 25:4—6, the psalmist wants to remain dependent upon God. So he asks for direction and teaching from God in the way he should live. He didn't want nice words or fine ideas, but God's ways and paths, which are the truth and good. And those who choose to believe God, make him the God of their salvation. And then they can come boldly to Him for direction. So, constant dependence and attention is on God. So the psalmist "waits" upon Him all day. Just like a waiter or waitress expects direction from those they're serving. Next, he appeals to God's infinite compassion and lovingkindness, and depends upon that, not pretending to have any credit of his own. In fact the psalmist has been dependent on God's grace from times passed. So he pleads, Lord, remember Your compassion, which speaks for me, and not my sins, which speaks against me.

Therefore he is in a dependency for the pardon of his sins; and especially not to remember the sins of his youth. This is an implicit confession of sin; he specifies the sins of his youth, but sins of any age should be matter of our repentance, because time does not wear out the guilt of sin. When God pardons sin, He remembers it no more, which denotes; He forgives and forgets it. It is God's goodness and not ours, his mercy and not our own merit, that must be our plea for forgiveness of sin. This plea we must always rely upon, as those that are sensible of our poverty and unworthiness and as those that are dependent on the riches of God's mercy and grace.

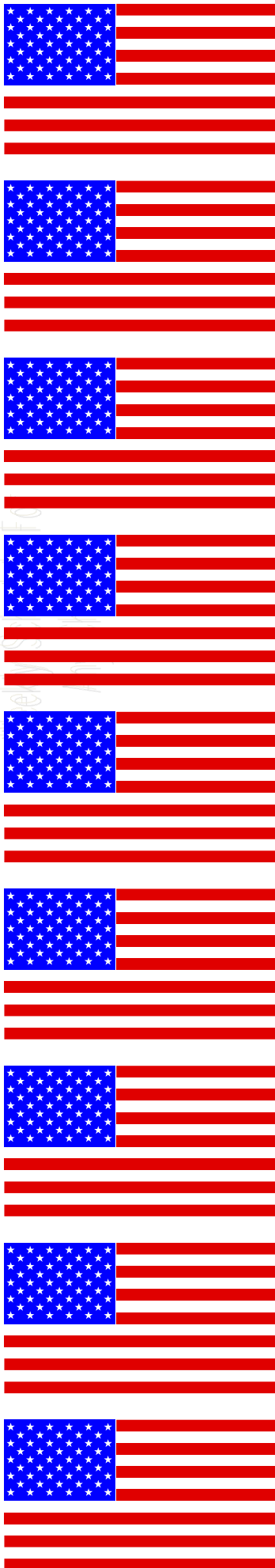
Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through Me." (Jn.14:6), therefore we are dependent on Him. He also declared, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing" ([John 15:5](#)), indicating our daily dependence.

Far from being self-reliant, we are totally and eternally dependent on the Jesus who died to set us free. Therefore every day is our "dependence day."

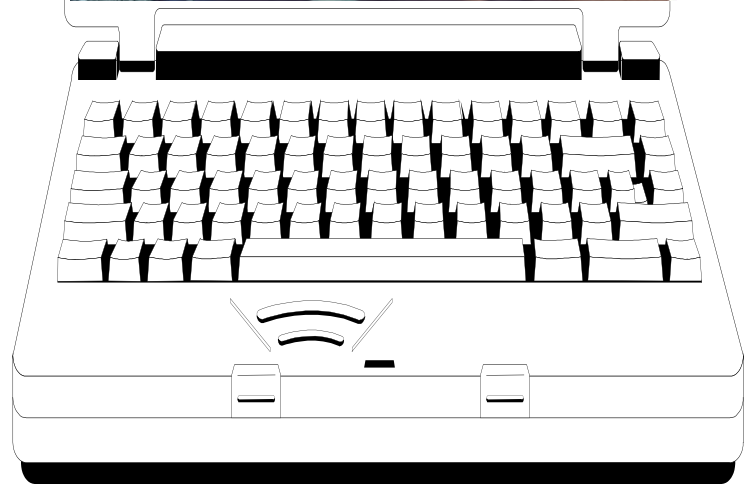

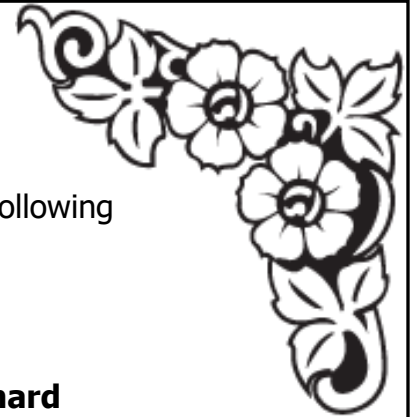

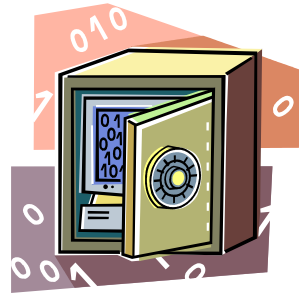

Tips for Keeping Your Money and Valuables Safe



Although we discourage residents from keeping money and valuables in their room, we realize that many of you will choose to do so. Therefore, we would like to offer these tips to help you keep your money and valuables safe from loss or theft. Since you have access to the money in your account during normal business hours Monday through Friday, we suggest that you only withdraw the amount you need for immediate use. If you need larger sums of money for gifts or to reimburse your family members for purchases made on your behalf, we suggest that you contact Financial Services to arrange for payment by check. If you choose to keep money and valuables in your room, we highly recommend that you secure such items in the locked drawer of your bedside cabinet. Keep your key with you, or keep your key out of sight in a safe place. As soon as you realize that your money or property is missing, it is important to report it immediately to the Charge Nurse. Cedarbrook will not assume responsibility for replacing missing property kept by residents on their person or in their room. However, we will take action to investigate, and to try to recover your property if possible. Finally, we ask that you help us maintain a current inventory of your personal property. Any property that you purchase or receive during your stay should be added to your Valuables Received After Admission Form, including a description of the property. This information is essential when trying to locate missing items.
