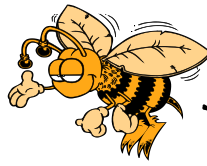

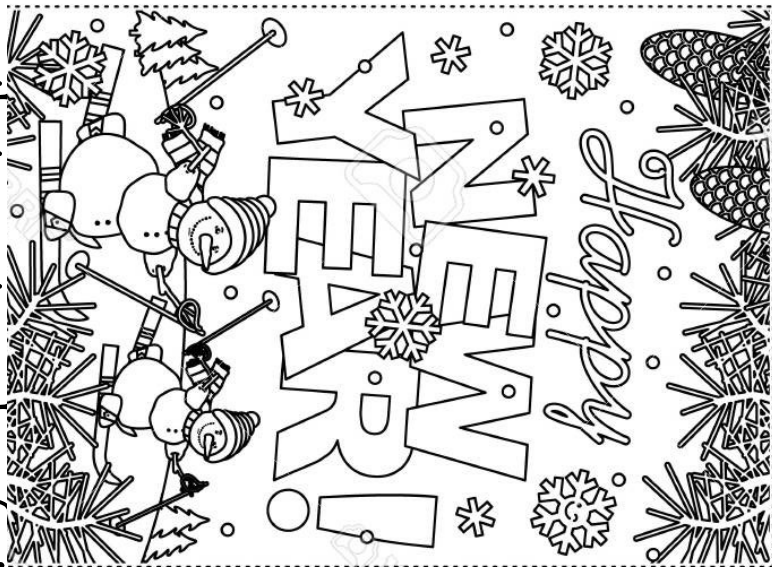
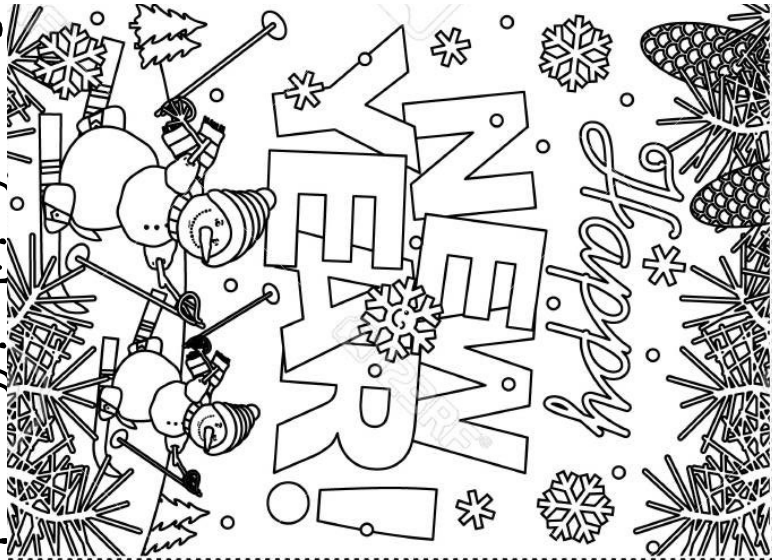

Chaplains Corner



I sometimes think New Year's Day comes at the wrong time of year. We all are usually facing a bunch of tasks left over from the old year. And we are anticipating the coming year to be different and that we ourselves are also going to change. Then the thought of trying to catch up with all the things that we put off during last year creeps up behind us. So, we feel behind before the New Year even starts. So, who can think about new beginnings or inspirational goals in the midst of the old concerns?

A husband came home from work and said, "Let me show you a gift I just received." He then began pulling an attractively wrapped package out of a gift bag. On it was a card: "May, this gift encourage you in the coming year." It was signed by a friend. His wife tore off the paper and lifted out a beautifully framed message, penned by a professional calligrapher. The message read: **Trust Me. I have everything under control. Jesus**

So, let's think about some devotion towards the Father, the Son Jesus and the Holy Spirit. There is a great need to welcome the New Year with some type of devotion so that everything that comes our way can be adjusted from God's perspective. It is pretty important to have some devotion in our lives that will in turn help us seek God and His good.

There are so many voices telling us what to do, what to stop doing, and what we're doing wrong that can be fixed in the New Year. And many of those voices will be telling us good things. Noble things. But as humans, we are so drawn to all this "self-help."

When He is our focus, our inspiration, and our example. In the Greek, looking to Jesus uses a verb that implies a definite looking away from other things and a present looking to Jesus.

When we are focused on Jesus, good things stay in their proper place. They are good things only so long as they do not displace Jesus as the Ruler of our hearts. When we remember our relationship to God through Jesus—that we are loved, forgiven and can be directed by Him—we won't feel the need to achieve some of those frustrating New Year's resolutions! Paul said in 2 Corinthians 12:9, **"My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness." Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me".**

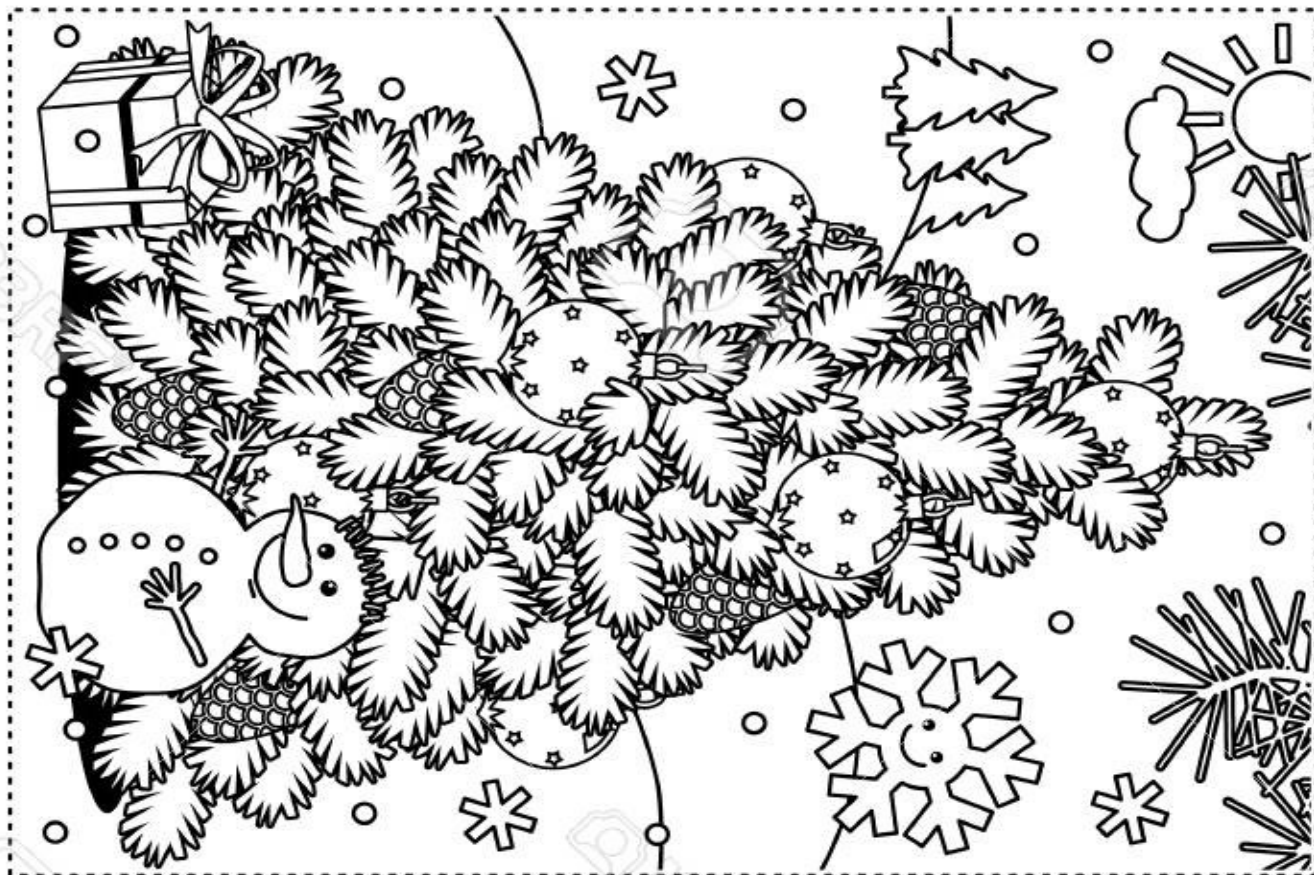
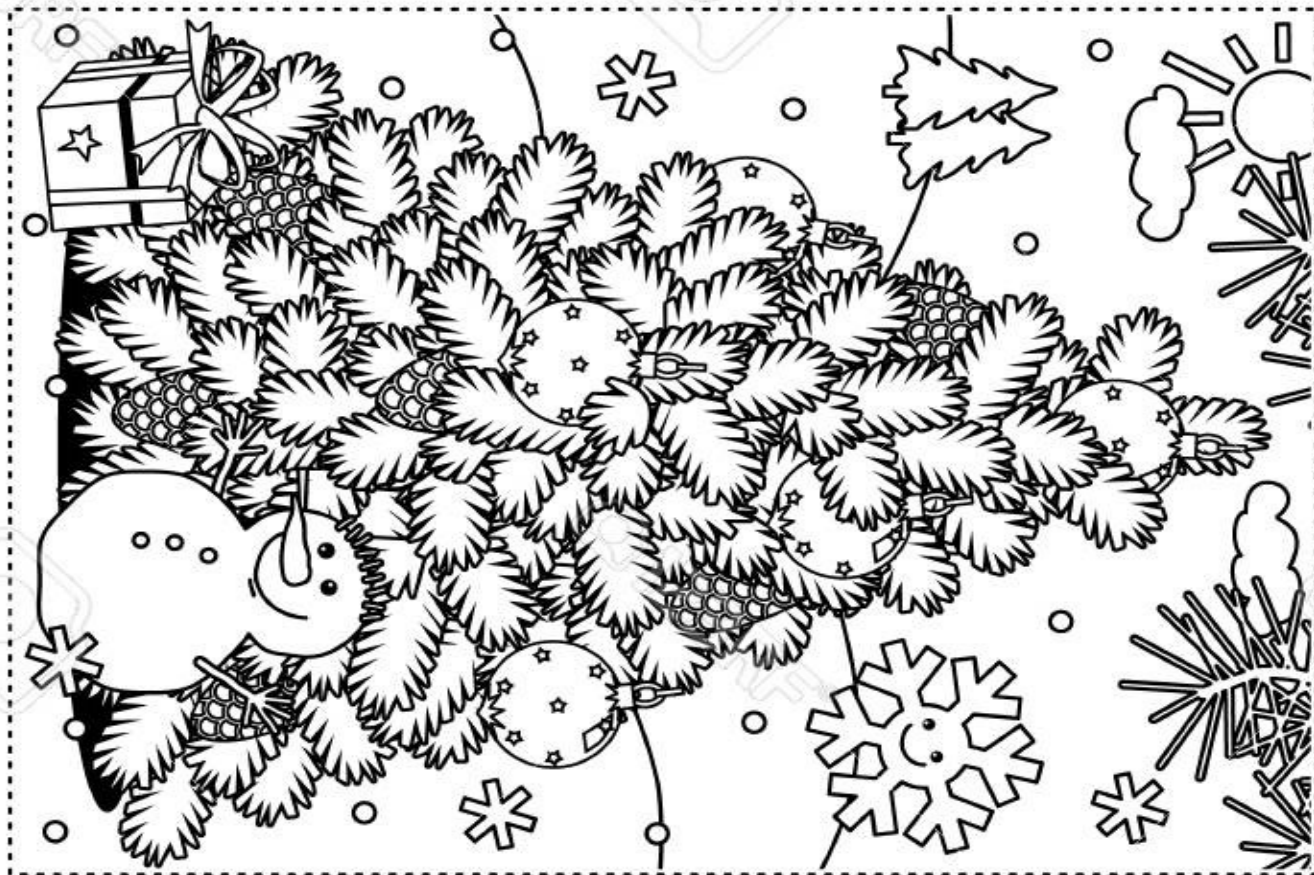

Porkloin, Apples, and Sauerkraut

Ingredients

- 3 (32 oz. packages sauerkraut, drained
- 2 Granny Smith apples, sliced
- 1/2 large onion, coarsely chopped
- 1 tablespoon caraway seeds
- 1 cup apple cider, divided
- 1/4 cup brown sugar

RUB:

- 1 Tbsp Thai seasoning
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black
- 1 (5 lb.) boneless porkloin roast

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 325 degreesF (165 degrees C).

Step One Preheat oven to 325 degrees ((165 degreesC)

Step Two Mix sauerkraut, apples, onion, and caraway seeds in a large roasting pan. Stir 1/4 cup apple cider and brown sugar together in a separate bowl; pour over sauerkraut mixture.

STEP 3 Stir Thai seasoning, salt, garlic powder, and black pepper together in a small bowl, rub onto the top and bottom of the roast.

STEP FOUR Make an indentation in the center of the sauerkraut mixture and place the seasoned roast I the indentation. Pour the remaining apple cider around the roast.

STEP FIVE Bake in the preheated oven for 1 hour; baste roast with juices. Continue baking roast basting every 30 minutes until cooked through, 2-1/2 to 3 hours. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 145 degrees F (63 degrees C)



RICH AND SIMPLE FRENCH ONION SOUP

INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 4 cups sliced onions
- 4 (10.5 ounce) cans beef broth
- 2 tablespoons dry sherry
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 4 slices French bread
- 4 slices Provolone cheese
- 2 slices Swiss cheese, diced
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

DIRECTIONS:

STEP 1 Melt butter with olive oil in an 8 quart stock pot on medium heat. Add onions and continually stir until tender and translucent. Do not brown the onions.

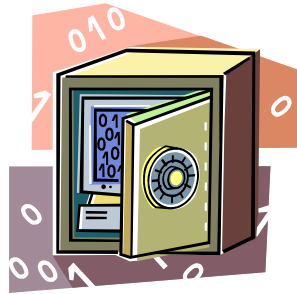
STEP 2 Add Beef broth, sherry and thyme. Season with salt and pepper, and simmer for 30 minutes

STEP 3 Heat the oven broiler.

STEP 4 Ladle soup into oven safe serving bowls and place one slice of bread on top of each (bread may be broken into pieces if you prefer). Layer each slice of bread with a slice of provolone, 1/2 slice diced Swiss and 1 tablespoon Parmesan cheese. Place bowls on cookie sheet and broil in the preheated oven until cheese bubbles and browns slightly.



Tips for Keeping Your Money and Valuables Safe



Although we discourage residents from keeping money and valuables in their room, we realize that many of you will choose to do so. Therefore, we would like to offer these tips to help you keep your money and valuables safe from loss or theft. Since you have access to the money in your account during normal business hours Monday through Friday, we suggest that you only withdraw the amount you need for immediate use. If you need larger sums of money for gifts or to reimburse your family members for purchases made on your behalf, we suggest that you contact Financial Services to arrange for payment by check. If you choose to keep money and valuables in your room, we highly recommend that you secure such items in the locked drawer of your bedside cabinet. Keep your key with you, or keep your key out of sight in a safe place. As soon as you realize that your money or property is missing, it is important to report it immediately to the Charge Nurse. Cedarbrook will not assume responsibility for replacing missing property kept by residents on their person or in their room. However, we will take action to investigate, and to try to recover your property if possible. Finally, we ask that you help us maintain a current inventory of your personal property. Any property that you purchase or receive during your stay should be added to your Valuables Received After Admission Form, including a description of the property. This information is essential when trying to locate missing items.
