

### <u>**Ruth</u>** By Chaplain Lily Kubala</u>

May is the month we traditionally associate with Mother's Day. The Bible gives few better examples of honoring one's mother (or mother-in-law as the case may be) than the Book of Ruth.

Ruth is the 8<sup>th</sup> book in the Old Testament, falling between Judges and 1 Samuel. The Book of Ruth is only four short chapters long, and typically only takes about 15 minutes to read in its entirety. I would encourage you to do so! It is such a beautiful story of love, loyalty and redemption. The name Ruth even means "companion." Ruth was a loyal companion to her mother-in-law, Naomi.

Naomi and her husband had two sons, Mahlon and Chilion. They lived in the town of Bethlehem, in the land of Judah. The land of Judah was experiencing a deadly famine, and so Naomi and her small family set out for the land of Moab. In Moab, Naomi's husband died. Naomi raised her two sons there, and they married Moabite women. Naomi's two daughters in law were Orpah and Ruth. Neither daughter in law had yet had any children. So, Naomi was left bitter and alone, with no husband and no son to care for her. She set her heart on returning to previous home and the land she owned in Bethlehem.

Naomi could hardly expect either Ruth or Orpah to leave their own homeland of Moab to accompany her, and Orpah didn't. But Ruth did. Ruth refused to leave her mother-in-law, whom she loved. The two made the long journey back to Judah together, only to find that Naomi was about to lose her home and property in Bethlehem. Naomi simply had no 'kinsman-redeemer' to protect her. A kinsman-redeemer would purchase the property of a woman in poverty. The kinsman-redeemer is a rescuer and restorer. But, the story is about to become a very happy one. Ruth is about to meet Boaz, a loving and very wealthy man in Bethlehem who comes forth as Ruth's kinsman-redeemer. Boaz and Ruth marry and Ruth bears a son, whom she delivers to her mother in law to continue the family line. A very happy ending, indeed.

The details are well worth reading for yourself, but suffice it to say that Ruth's loyalty to her mother-in-law is well rewarded. The word 'redemption' occurs 23 times in the short book. Boaz is a forerunner of the kinsman-redeemer that we have in Jesus Christ.

In the end, Boaz not only fulfills the role of a kinsman-redeemer for Ruth, but he loves her deeply and theirs becomes a beautiful story of its own. You may recall that Boaz and Ruth are mentioned in the lineage of Jesus Christ. Ruth 4:21 tells us that Boaz begat Obed, and Obed begat Jesse and Jesse begat David. The town of Bethlehem is eventually renamed the City of David, where Jesus is born. Ruth becomes the great-grandmother of King David, a lineage that continues directly to the birth of Jesus. How marvelous to rediscover the rich history of our Lord and Savior through the Book of Ruth during the month that celebrates all mothers who fulfilled the law to love one another.

Boaz replied, "I've been told all about what you have done for your mother-in-law since the death of your husband—how you left your father and mother and your homeland and came to live with a people you did not know before. <sup>12</sup> May the LORD repay you for what you have done. May you be richly rewarded by the LORD, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge."

**Memorial Day.** Maybe you think of it as the beginning of summer and time for a barbecue. While that's all fun and good, it's important that we don't forget what the holiday is all about. Here are some facts about why we really celebrate Memorial Day. Hint: None of them involve hot dogs.

- The tradition of decorating soldiers' graves with flowers and flags is what led to the creation of Memorial Day. It was especially popular to decorate the graves of Civil War soldiers, and some regions designated a day of the year to do so. Eventually, these days would merge to become a national Memorial Day.
- Memorial Day was officially established as a national public holiday in 1868 by General John A. Logan, head of a group of Union veterans. The holiday was originally called Decoration Day–named for the decoration of soldiers' graves–but the name gradually changed until it officially became Memorial Day in 1967.
- From 1868 to 1970, Memorial Day was celebrated every year on May 30, not the last Monday of May like we do now. It's unclear why this date was chosen, though some have speculated that it's because no major battles had occurred on that day, or that spring flowers would be in bloom.
- The date was changed in 1968 with the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which moved Memorial Day and four other holidays to Mondays for the sake of creating the three-day weekends we all know and love. Some veterans' organizations and lawmakers disagree with the change, arguing that it diminishes the holiday's meaning.
- Memorial Day is not the same as Veteran's Day. The latter celebrates all service men and women throughout history, while Memorial Day technically only celebrates those who died while serving. Armed Forces Day is also separate, and honors those who are currently serving.

### **Residents' Council Meeting Minutes** Monday – April 10, 2023

Jean Larison, President, called the meeting to order. Karen Snyder, Secretary, read the highlights from the March meeting. Marilyn Barker, Vice President, read the Resident Right for April.



#### **ADMISSION POLICY**-

Your nursing facility cannot prohibit or discourage you from applying for or receiving Medicare or medical assistance benefits. Your nursing facility must prominently display or provide you with individually written and oral information about how to apply for Medicare or medical assistance benefits, how to use these benefits and how to receive refunds for any prior payments made by you that are covered by these benefits.

If you are entitled to medical assistance for nursing facility services, neither you nor anyone on your behalf may be required by the nursing facility to make any payments to the nursing facility as a condition of your admission, to speed up your admission or to guarantee your continued stay in the nursing facility. This requirement does not stop the nursing facility from requesting, accepting, or receiving genuine charitable, religious or humanitarian contributions from organizations or people that are not related to you, if the contribution is not a condition of your admission, to speed up your admission or to guarantee your continued stay in the nursing facility.

The nursing facility must advise you in advance when payments for items or services to be delivered are not covered by the Medical Assistance Program. You must be advised of the costs of the non-covered items or services, and be given the option of accepting or rejecting the charges and the non-covered items or services. This requirement does not stop a nursing facility from charging you for items or services which you requested and received that are not covered by the Medical Assistance Program.


