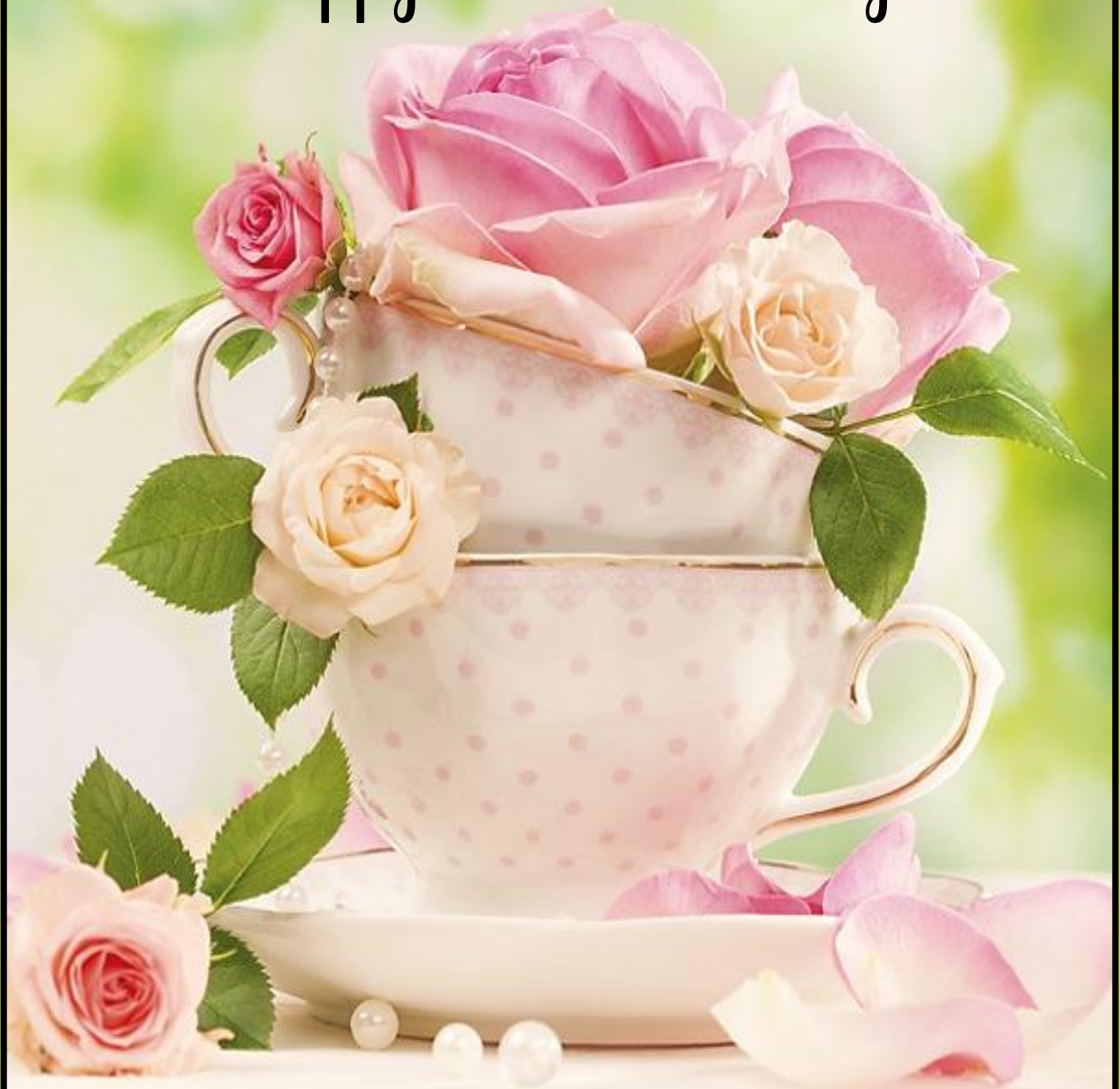

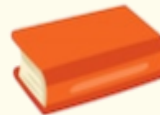

In medieval times, similar customs abounded, all centering around the practice of expelling winter, as May 1st was considered the start of new growth. The connection between Mary and the month of May can be traced back to ancient times when the Greeks and Romans celebrated spring festivals dedicated to deities who represented fertility and beauty. For the Romans, this was the goddess Flora, celebrated during the Floralia.

Here's a more detailed explanation:

➤ **Month of Mary:**

The month of May is often referred to as the Month of Mary, a time for Catholics to focus on Mary, the mother of Jesus, and offer special prayers and devotions to her.

➤ **Historical Significance:**

The tradition of dedicating May to Mary can be traced back to the medieval period, when May was seen as the end of winter and the start of a new season of growth.

➤ **Devotions:**

During May, Catholics may engage in various Marian devotions, such as praying the rosary, singing Marian hymns, and reading scripture associated with Our Lady.

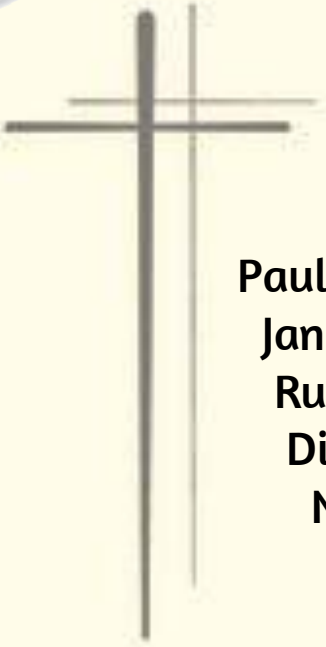
➤ **May Crowning:**

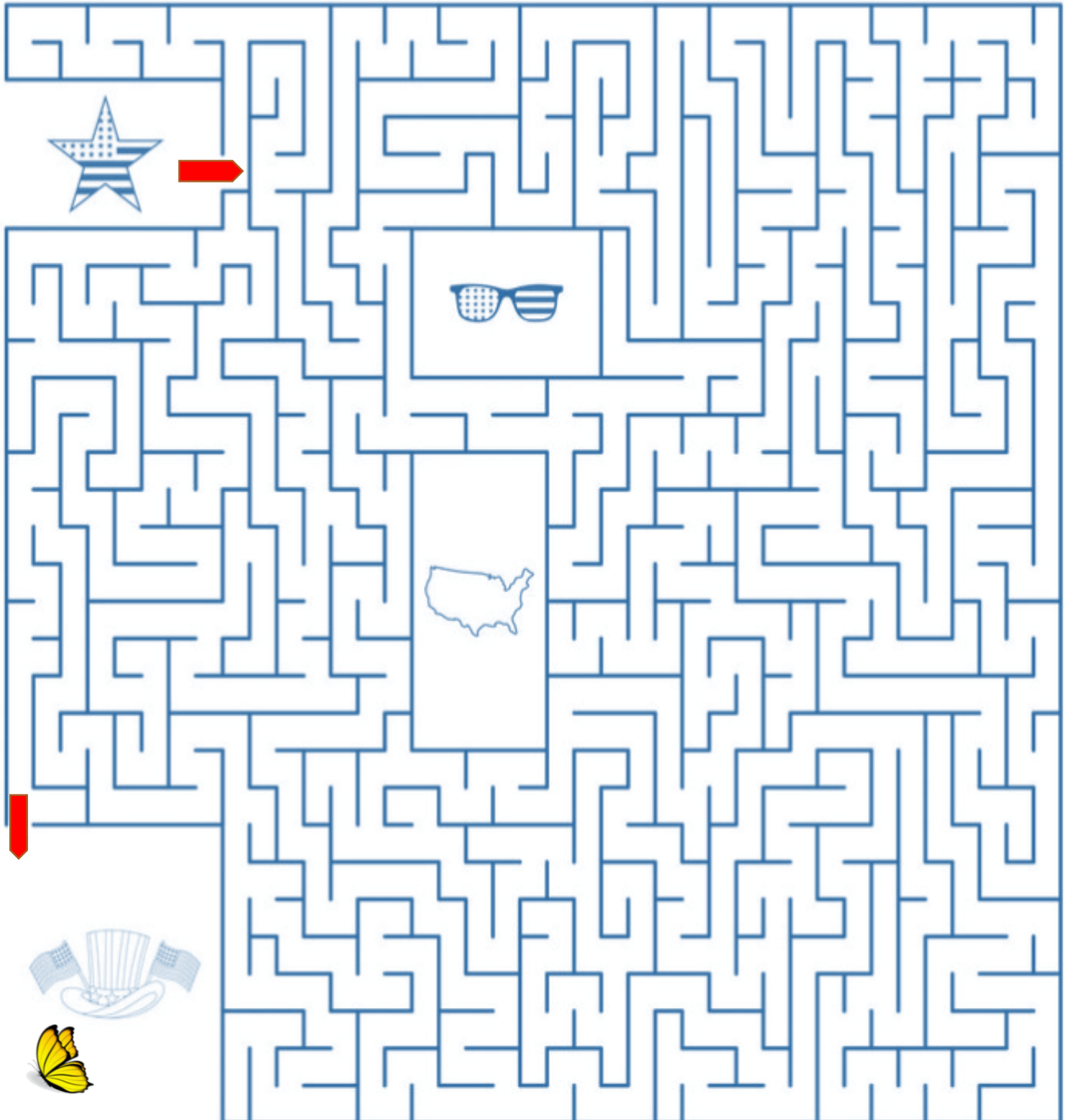

FREEDOM FROM RESTRAINTS – Sec. 1919(c)(1)

You have the right to be free from physical or mental abuse, corporal punishment, involuntary seclusion, and any physical or chemical restraints unless they are required to treat your medical symptoms and are not used for purposes of discipline or for the convenience of staff. Restraints may only be used to ensure your physical safety or the safety of other residents. These limitations must be based upon the written order of a physician which specifies the duration and circumstances which require such restraints.

SPRING FLOWERS FUN FACTS



Daffodils

"Rebirth & New Beginnings"

- Bulb flowers are native to fields and woods in Southern Europe and North Africa.
- There are 13 different classifications of Daffodils – Trumpet, Large Cup, Small Cup, Double, Triandrus, Cyclamineus, Jonquilla, Split Corona, Poeticus, and Tazetta.
- Daffodils are one of the first perennials to bloom after the winter frost.



Hyacinth

"Sincerity, Sport & Play"

- Hyacinth bloom in the Spring, once per year.
- They are bulb Flowers that are very fragrant.
- Used in celebration of the Persian New Year.



Heather

"Good Luck, Independence & Protection"

- Originates from Europe and South Asia.
- Characterized by their fragrance and small flower buds that are usually pink, purple, or white.
- These flowers have been used to make aromatic brooms.




Tulips

"Fame, Love & Passion"

- Tulips come in over 3,000 varieties within 14 different types.
- Red tulips are the most popular kind due to their romantic symbolism.
- These Spring blooms are bulb flowers and originate from Iran.

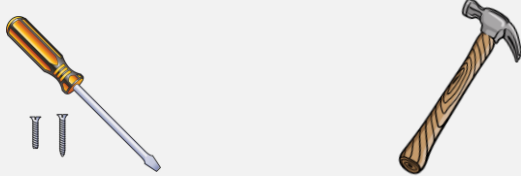
