# CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

In the Catholic tradition, October is the Month of the Holy Rosary, a period dedicated to the prayer and meditation of the Rosary, which focuses on key events in the lives of Jesus and the Virgin Mary. This devotion commemorates the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7, which was established by Pope St. Pius V to celebrate the Christian victory at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571, a triumph attributed to the power of the Rosary. People are encouraged to pray the Rosary daily during this month to strengthen their faith and draw closer to Jesus through Mary.

What is the Holy Rosary?

The Rosary is a well-known Catholic devotion involving a series of prayers, meditations on the life of Christ, and the use of a string of beads to keep track of the prayers.

It serves as a way to meditate on the “mysteries,” or significant events, in the lives of Jesus and Mary, offering a catechetical and scriptural focus for prayer.

Why October?

## Battle of Lepanto:

The month was chosen in honor of the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7), which marks the decisive victory of Christian forces over the Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571.

## Prayer for Victory:

Pope Pius V had called for all Catholics to pray the Holy Rosary for victory in the battle, and the victory was seen as a direct answer to these prayers.

How to observe the October Devotion:

## Pray the Rosary:

The most direct way to observe this devotion is to pray the Rosary, particularly on a daily basis throughout October.

## Meditate on the Mysteries:

As you pray, meditate on the events of Christ's life and Mary's life that are presented in the Rosary.

The month provides an opportunity to begin, renew, or deepen your devotion to the Rosary and to draw closer to God.

- Michelle Julian shared what the expectations are for a Residents' Council Meeting:
  - Please don't wait until the meeting to bring up concerns. Please reach out as soon as there is a concern.
  - To report a problem or concern: Residents can go to any staff member on their stations, their nurse, social worker, any LE member or any officers of Resident Council.
  - Resident Council referrals, once written up, go to Heidi, council liaison, who then reviews it and sends it to the proper department. Lastly, it is then shared at the next Residents' Council meeting.
  - The facility's Code of Conduct has been shared with all residents and families. We need to do our best to follow the facility's Code of Conduct.
  - It was shared with all residents that the Resident Council Officers from both facilities will be working together to attend each other's meetings to give feed back and help support each facility.
  - Heidi shared that October is Resident's Rights Month. So we will be reviewing all resident rights with a trivia game instead of a traditional meeting in October.
  - Heidi also announced we will be looking for new Resident Council Officers, so please start thinking about who you would like to nominate for the year 2026.

- Residents were invited to attend the Food Committee Meeting immediately following Residents' Council.

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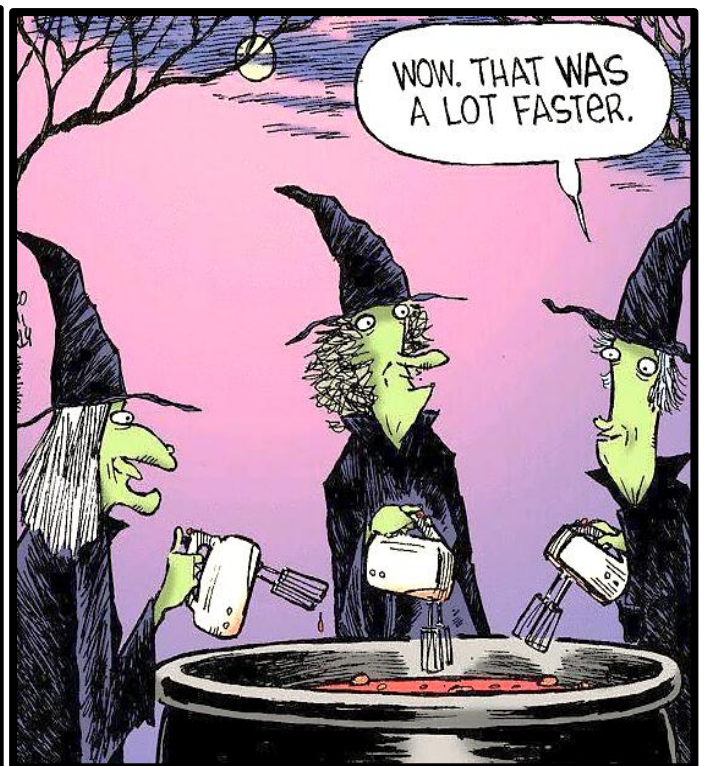

# APPLE PUMPKIN CRISP

## INGREDIENTS

### Filling

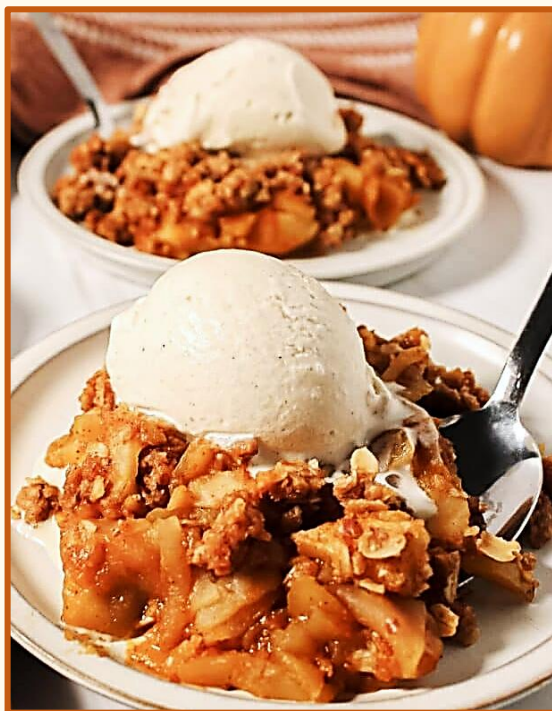
- 3 pounds of crisp apples Honeycrisp, Granny Smith, or any crisp apple variety, peeled, cored, and diced
- $\frac{2}{3}$  cup pure pumpkin purée
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup brown sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon ground nutmeg
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon ground cloves
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup all-purpose flour

### Topping

- $\frac{2}{3}$  cup of all-purpose flour
- $\frac{2}{3}$  cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon ground nutmeg
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon ground cloves
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup cold butter 1 stick cut into cubes
- 1 cup whole rolled oats

## INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Preheat Oven:** Preheat your oven to 350°F. Grease a 14x9 rectangle baking dish or similar-sized dish.
2. **Prepare the Filling:** In a large bowl, combine the diced apples with the pumpkin purée, brown sugar, granulated sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves, and vanilla extract. Toss until the apples are well-coated and evenly mixed with the pumpkin.
3. **Make the Crisp Topping:** In another bowl place the flour, brown sugar, ground cinnamon, ground nutmeg, ground cloves and stir until well combined. Add the cold, cubed butter and use a pastry cutter or your fingers to work the butter into the dry ingredients until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in the oats.
4. **Assemble the Crisp:** Pour the apple and pumpkin mixture into the prepared baking dish, spreading it out evenly. Sprinkle the crisp topping over the apple mixture, ensuring it's evenly distributed.
5. **Bake:** Bake in the preheated oven for 40-45 minutes, or until the topping is golden brown and the filling is bubbly.
6. **Cool and Serve:** Allow the apple crisp to cool for about 10 minutes before serving. It can be served warm or at room temperature. Serve with a scoop of vanilla ice cream or a dollop of whipped cream for an extra indulgent treat.

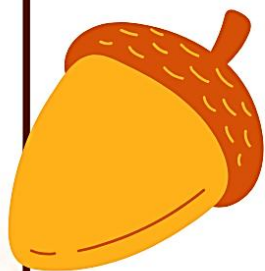
