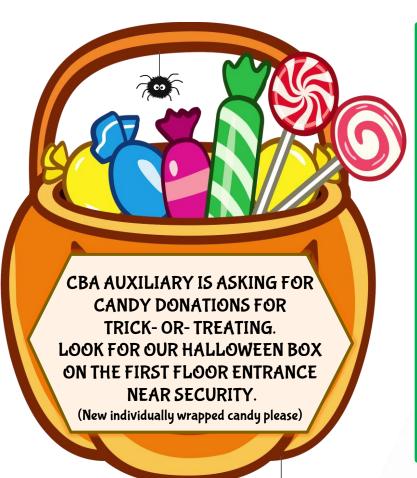

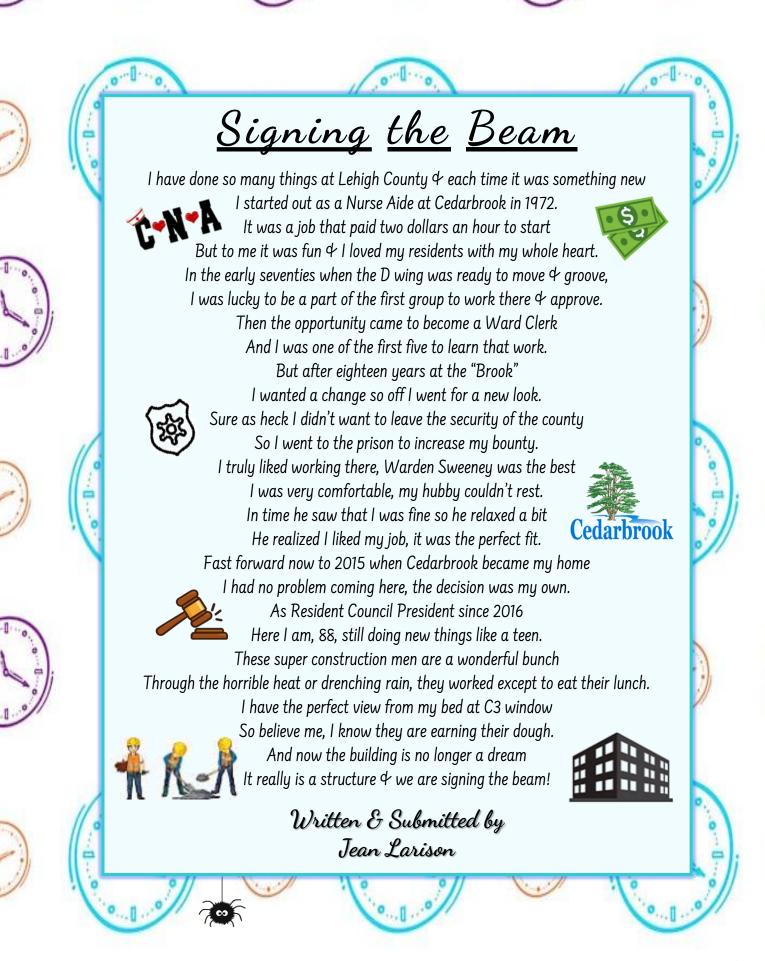

In the Catholic tradition, October is the Month of the Holy Rosary, a period dedicated to the prayer and meditation of the Rosary, which focuses on key events in the lives of Jesus and the Virgin Mary. This devotion commemorates the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary on October 7, which was established by Pope St. Pius V to celebrate the Christian victory at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571, a triumph attributed to the power of the Rosary. People are encouraged to pray the Rosary daily during this month to strengthen their faith and draw closer to Jesus through Mary.

What is the Holy Rosary?

The Rosary is a well-known Catholic devotion involving a series of prayers, <u>meditations on the life of Christ</u>, and the use of a string of beads to keep track of the prayers.

It serves as a way to meditate on the "mysteries," or significant events, in the lives of Jesus and Mary, offering a catechetical and scriptural focus for prayer.

Why October?

Battle of Lepanto:

The month was chosen in honor of the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7), which marks the decisive victory of Christian forces over the Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto in 1571.

Prayer for Victory:

Pope Pius V had called for all Catholics to pray the Holy Rosary for victory in the battle, and the victory was seen as a direct answer to these prayers.

How to observe the October Devotion:

Pray the Rosary:

The most direct way to observe this devotion is to pray the Rosary, particularly on a daily basis throughout October.

Meditate on the Mysteries:

As you pray, meditate on the events of Christ's life and Mary's life that are presented in the Rosary.

The month provides an opportunity to begin, renew, or deepen your devotion to the Rosary and to draw closer to God.

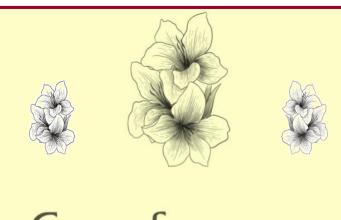

This bar was named after a horse owned by the creator of the candy, the Mars family.



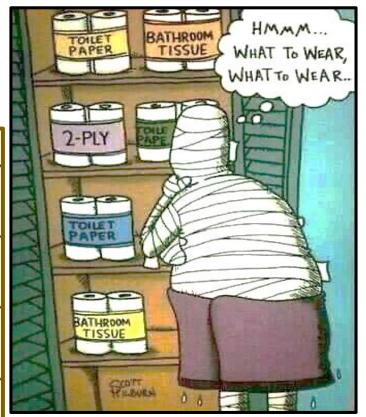
Eating lots of Halloween candy in one sitting will cause cavities.

PUMPKIN MUFFINS



INGREDIENTS

- Cooking spray or paper muffin liners
- •3/4 cup granulated sugar
- •1/2 cup vegetable oil
- •2 large eggs
- •1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice
- •1 teaspoon baking soda
- •1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- •1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- •1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- •1 (15-ounce) can pumpkin purée (not pumpkin pie filling)





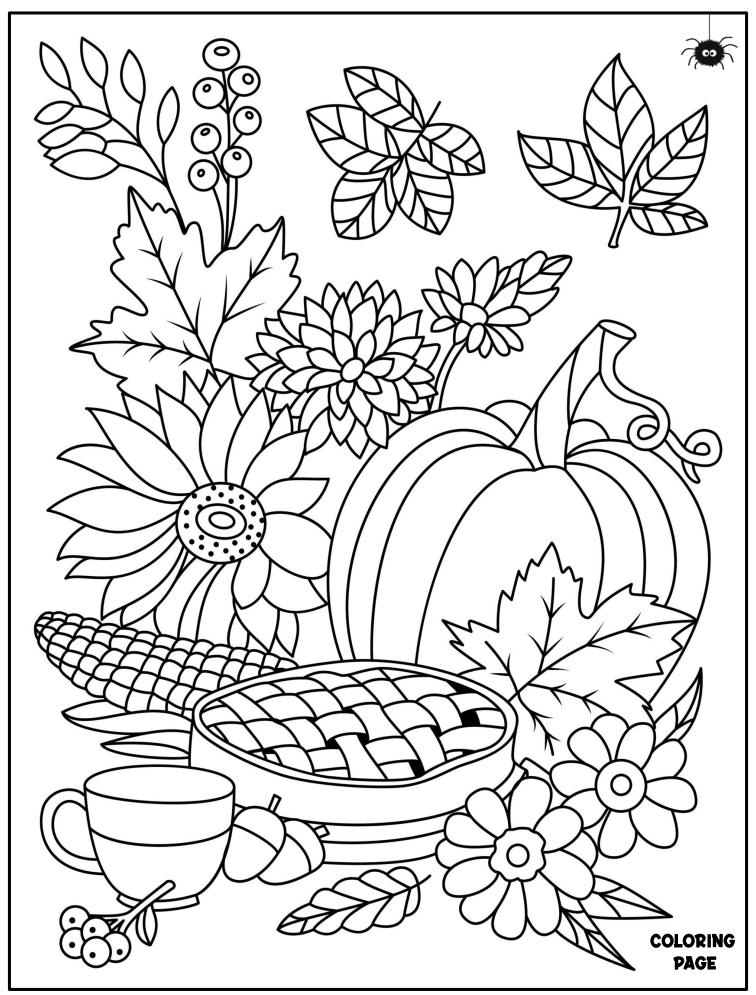
INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Heat the oven to 375°F. Line a standard 12-well muffin pan with paper liners or coat the wells with cooking spray.
- 2. Whisk 1 (15-ounce) can pumpkin purée, 3/4 cup granulated sugar, 1/2 cup neutral oil, 2 large eggs, 1 tablespoon pumpkin pie spice, 1 teaspoon baking soda, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, and 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt together in a large bowl until combined and smooth.
- 3. Add 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour and fold it in with a flexible spatula until just incorporated but no dry spots remain. Divide the batter evenly among the muffin wells (about 1/3 cup per well); the wells will be almost full.
- 4. Bake, rotating the pan halfway through, until the muffins are golden-brown, the tops bounce back when pressed, and a tester inserted into the center of a muffin comes out clean, 25 to 30 minutes total.
- 5. Let the muffins cool in the pan for 5 minutes, then transfer to a wire rack and let cool completely.
