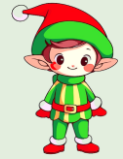

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: ²³ "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us). ²⁴ When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife, ²⁵ but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus. (Matthew 1:18-25)

As Matthew retells the circumstances around the birth of Jesus, he reveals to us just what kind of man God chose to care for and nurture His Son.

According to the law of Moses in the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy, Mary could have been executed by stoning. At the very least, she faced a lifetime of shame if Joseph publicly divorced her. But even as Joseph agonizes over what appears to be Mary's betrayal, he still has mercy on Mary. He is a righteous man whose desire for justice is tempered with mercy. He balances God's law with God's love.

Can you perceive God's wisdom in choosing Joseph? Joseph obeys God's commands over man-made laws. He is patient and does not act upon anger. He will sacrifice his reputation, and forget his anger, to obey God's command to have mercy on the weak and oppressed. Joseph's obedience to God saves Mary and her unborn child from the threat of shame and death. We can see how Joseph will teach Jesus mercy towards others as the basis of God's law.


Because Joseph is also a humble man before God, he is also ready to listen when God speaks to him through an angel in a dream who tells Joseph to not fear the consequences of taking Mary as his wife, and to take the child as his own, adopting Jesus into the line of David. We naturally fear certain things, and that is unavoidable. It is what we do in response to fear that counts.

I once saw a life-sized sculpture depicting Joseph, working at his carpenter's bench, and his young son Jesus, sitting at the other end. Joseph, his hands on a lathe, stops to listen to Jesus, who gestures as he is talking. That moment, frozen in the bronze sculpture, invites us to imagine how Jesus learned how to live by watching his adoptive father, in the workplace, in the home, in the synagogue and the marketplace. Jesus learned how to tell stories, how to respond to others with love and compassion, how to sacrifice for others, and how to worship God. Joseph taught his son to not fear whatever God calls him to do, and that a righteous man is one who simply and promptly obeys God's word to him.

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ, let us remember that the days in the life of Joseph and Mary leading up to Jesus's birth were days just like ours, filled with anticipation and wondering about what will happen. Like us, they needed to remain focused on God's promise that the child born to Mary would be Immanuel, "God with us," our God of mercy, not judgement; of love, not condemnation. May we come to understand more deeply that Jesus's birth is the love of God we did not earn, and in turn give generously of compassion to others, just as God has shown us.

Christmas Facts



St. Nick was more generous than jolly

The original Santa Claus was actually St. Nicholas, a Christian bishop in the 4th century. He didn't wear the red suit that's so famous today, but he did give all of his inheritance to the poor and needy.

In Dutch, his name is Sinter Klaas, which later morphed into Santa Claus.



Spider webs in your tree are good luck

An old Ukrainian folktale tells about a poor woman who was too poor to decorate her Christmas tree. As she slept, spiders wove her hundreds of intricate webs that served as beautiful ornaments. When Ukrainians find a spider web in their Christmas tree, they consider it good luck.



The first Christmas card was sent in 1843

The first Christmas card was created and sent by Sir Henry Cole, an English politician. The three-paneled card was embossed with the message "Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to You." It was later printed and sold as the idea of the Christmas card took off.



Hanging stockings started by accident

The historic St. Nicholas heard about the plight of a local man who did not have enough dowry money to marry off his three daughters. The generous St. Nick tossed some money down the chimney that landed in the ladies' stockings that were drying by the fire. After that, the tradition stuck!



The eight tiny reindeer have had lots of names

Rudolph was almost named Rollo or Reginald and his crew also had lots of other names. They've previously been called Flossie, Glossie, Racer, Pacer, Scratcher, Feckless, Ready, Steady and Fireball.

Candy canes originated in Germany

The National Confectioners

Association says a choirmaster originally gave the red-and-white-striped candies to young children to keep them quiet during marathon church services back in 1670. It wasn't until a German-Swedish immigrant decorated his tree with candy canes in 1847 that they became popular as a Christmas candy.



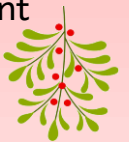
Fruits were the first ornaments

In the late 17th century, people used fruits like apples, pears, and oranges to decorate Christmas trees. In fact, edible ornaments were so popular that many began to call Christmas trees "sugar trees."



But Mistletoe isn't as sweet as it sounds

Mistle thrush birds eat the plant's berries, digest the seed and then help the plant germinate with their droppings. The Germanic word for mistletoe literally means "dung on a twig." Really makes you want to pucker up, doesn't it?



Tinsel has a storied history

Tinsel was invented in 1610 in Germany. It was spun from real silver and then hammered out and was more of a luxury decoration than the cheap tree trimming it is today. The U.S. government once banned tinsel because it used to contain poisonous lead, but no need to worry now — it's just plastic.

Gingerbread Cheesecake Dip



Ingredients

- 1 (8-oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 3/4 cup packed dark brown sugar
- 2 Tbsp. whole milk
- 3/4 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 1/4 tsp. ground ginger
- 1/8 tsp. ground nutmeg
- 1/8 tsp. kosher salt
- Pinch of ground cloves
- Colored sprinkles
- 1 1/2 cups store-bought or homemade whipped cream or refrigerated Cool Whip (not frozen)
- Gingerbread cookies, pretzels rods, Nilla wafers or graham crackers for serving



Directions



1. In a large bowl, using a handheld mixer on medium-high speed, beat cream cheese until smooth and fluffy. Add brown sugar, milk, cinnamon, vanilla, ginger, nutmeg, salt, and cloves and beat until smooth and combined. Add whipped cream and gently fold to combine.
2. Transfer dip to a serving bowl. Top with sprinkles (if using). Serve with gingerbread cookies alongside. Can also use graham crackers or Nilla Wafers for dipping. Or for a sweet and salty taste use pretzel rods for dipping.

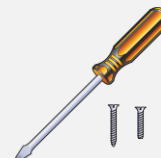
