Why do people celebrate Easter?



Many see Easter as a time to celebrate the return of longer days of sunshine, and the joy of springtime rebirth and new beginnings. For Christians, it's the most important holiday of the year that closes out Lent and marks the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Most often time is spent in church and many churches offer a sunrise service on Easter Sunday since according to the story, Mary opened Jesus' tomb in the early morning. Whether your Easter celebration is religious or secular, it invites us all to share hope and joy with friends and family.

Ham is a staple Easter recipe for a reason.



A lot of you probably couldn't imagine an Easter without ham. It makes sense, considering it's a tradition that dates back years ago. Before we had refrigerators, people would cure ham during the winter months and when the ham thawed out by springtime, it made sense to use it as an Easter meal centerpiece.



The Easter Bunny.

The whimsical bunny we know and love began life as a hare, which was the sacred animal of Eostre, the Anglo-Saxon goddess of the dawn and spring. As Christianity spread through the Roman Empire, Pagan practices merged with newer Christian ones, which is why we now commonly see lighthearted images of bunnies and eggs alongside the more religious images of the cross at Easter.

When were the first chocolate Easter Eggs made?



Chocolate eggs are said to have originated in France and Germany in the early 19th century but in the UK it was J. S. Fry & Sons Limited who produced the first chocolate egg in 1873. John Cadbury made his first 'French eating Chocolate' in 1842 but it was not until 1875 that the first Cadbury Easter Eggs were made. The "filled" egg was first invented in 1923, but it wasn't until 1963 when they started to be sold under the name Fry's Creme Eggs. But, the name changed again to Cadbury Creme Eggs in 1971.

Easter lilies signify the true meaning of the holiday.



For one, the flower's white color can represent the purity and innocence of Jesus—with white usually representing such a message. There are also parallels between the lily's blooming process and Christ's resurrection. The bulb of the flower initially growing beneath Earth's surface is attributed to Jesus' death, while the actual sprout of the flower symbolizes his resurrection.



Colored eggs.



Exchanging eggs, another festive way to celebrate the spring equinox, is common in many cultures, as the egg is a symbol of fertility and the return of life. The first written evidence we have of coloring eggs is from 1290, when King Edward of England ordered 450 eggs embellished with gold foil to be given to members of his court. According to tradition, people would dye eggs different colors based on what the colors mean to the church. Yellow for resurrection, blue for love, and red for the blood of Jesus Christ.

Put a bonnet on it.



For centuries, newly baptized Christians have worn new white clothes to symbolize their spiritual rebirth. At Easter, new clothes represent the "new life" bestowed upon believers through the resurrection of Jesus. The first bonnets worn with Easter finery may have been a circle of leaves and flowers to signify new life, but over time they have become increasingly elaborate. From the 1870s to today, we have seen extravagant Easter bonnets on display in the annual Easter Parade held in New York City.



The first White House Easter Egg Roll was held in 1878.

The story of how it started is actually really cute. Apparently, President Rutherford B. Hayes was out for a stroll when he was stopped by children who gave him the idea of an Easter egg roll. It's safe to say he adored it, because it's been a tradition ever since.

She barks a lot! She famously begs for food, that's why her nickname is Mooch!

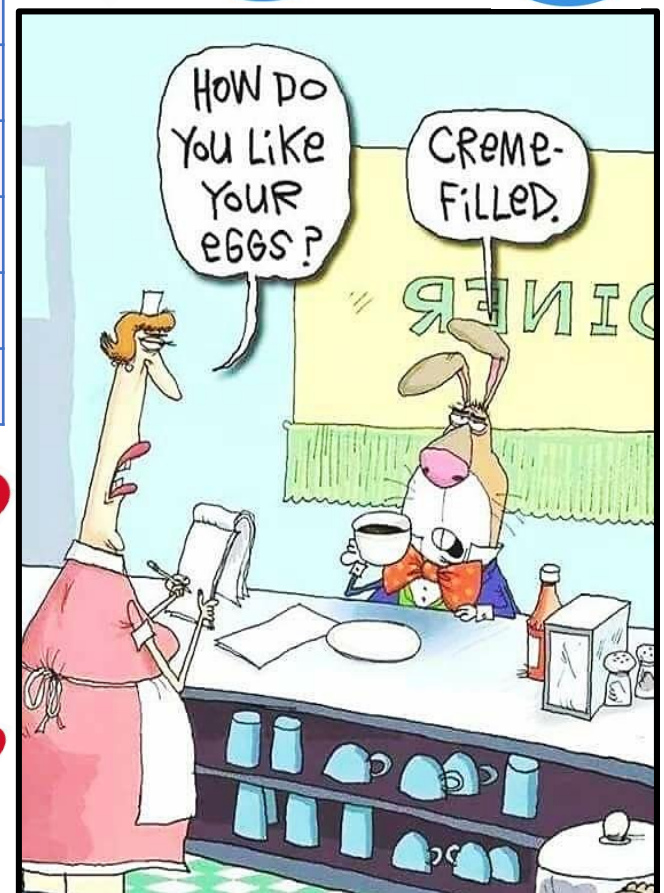

- Residents were invited to attend the Food Committee Meeting immediately following Residents' Council.

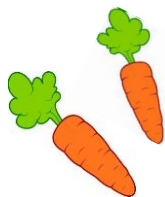




CARROT CAKE



- 3 eggs
- 1 1/3 cup flour
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 1/2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp. cloves
- 1 tsp. allspice
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 cup raisins
- 2/3 cup vegetable oil
- 5-6 carrots grated, enough for 3 cups



Cream Cheese Frosting Recipe

- 5 Tbsp. butter, softened
- 8 oz cream cheese softened
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 2 1/2 cup powdered sugar

1. In a small saucepan, add the raisins and cover with water. Place on low heat and simmer while you prepare your cake batter.
2. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees and grease a 9x13 pan or two 8 inch round pans.
3. In a large mixing bowl, add your flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves, allspice, and salt. Mix thoroughly to ensure that you have no clumps of any single ingredient.
4. Peel your carrots and grate them either using your food processor's grating blade or a hand grater. Grate until you have 3 cups of shredded carrot. You do not need to pack it down to get to the three cups.
5. In a separate bowl, crack your eggs and whisk them together. Once they are fairly well beaten, slowly add the oil to your eggs, while continuing to whisk so that your oil is emulsified into your eggs. This will help add some body to your cake.
6. Drain your raisins and set aside.
7. Make a well in the center of your dry ingredients. Pour the wet ingredients into the dry ingredients and stir gently with a spatula until most of the flour is absorbed. Add the carrots and raisins and stir again just until they are incorporated into your batter. It will be a fairly thick batter.
8. Pour your carrot cake batter into your prepped pans. Place into your 350 degree oven and bake for 35-38 minutes for the 9x13 pan or 25-30 minutes, until a cake tester comes out clean. Let cool thoroughly before frosting.

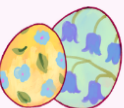


- In a bowl, add your butter and cream cheese. Beat until thoroughly combined and airy. Scrape down as necessary.
- Add the salt and vanilla bean paste and mix until combined, again scraping down your bowl to ensure all ingredients are mixed evenly.
- Turn your mixer off and add half your powdered sugar. Stir on low until it is mostly combined, then whip for 30 seconds. Turn your mixer off again and add the remaining powdered sugar, following the same steps.
- Once your frosting is thoroughly mixed, use it immediately or cover tightly to the surface with plastic wrap and refrigerate until you are ready to use it. You will need to let it warm up and remix it before using if you have stored it.
